THE JAVA TABLE will be open next Sunday between worship services. Fair trade coffees, teas, and chocolates will be available for purchase.

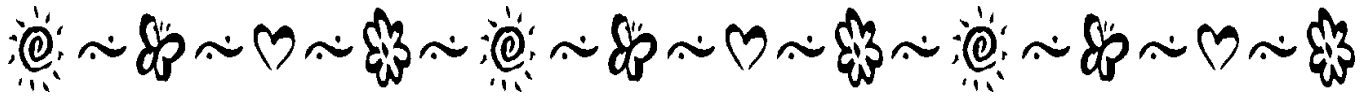

ACOLYTE ROBE CARETAKER NEEDED!

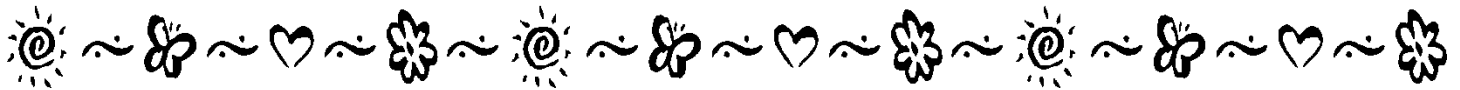
