
2018 LENTEN CONGREGATIONAL PROJECT

We've bought pigs, built "Lenten Loos" and supplied first aid kits to communities around the world.

This year let's help folks in different countries build community vegetable gardens! With a plot of land and good soil, adding drought-resistant seeds and topping it off with tools and training, plenty of tomatoes, potatoes, cabbage, beans and other vegetables can be grown to go around. Extra produce can be sold and the profit shared by the members of the cooperative to provide a great combination of food and income.



It takes about \$200.00 to start a community vegetable garden. Throughout the 40 days of Lent, we will be gathering offerings in our homes and bringing those offerings to worship on Easter Sunday (Place your offering in an envelope with your name and "Community Vegetable Garden" on the outside of the envelope.). How many gardens can those in need grow through our gifts?

-that the deadline for the May newsletter is Monday, April 16th. Please be prompt. You may submit your articles to office@felchurch.org.






New in our children's library:

In family emergencies, Westmoreland County Children's Bureau is contacted to make arrangements for children from birth to 21 years of age. Often times these children are removed from their homes with only the clothes on their backs and little if any personal belongings, such as a favorite stuffed animal. In 2017, there were 348 children in foster care in Westmoreland, an increase of 174% above the normal number of 200.

What's Next?

The Call Process of the PA SW Synod

Now that the Call Committee has been elected, what's next?

Members of the Call Committee and Church Council are currently attending 4 sessions of the "Healthy Congregations" Workshop Series.

These workshops teach Systems theory, which is a new way of thinking about both the congregation and its leadership. They also help leadership gain a renewed sense of purpose and mission, be better leaders in the congregation and help move the congregation toward a better understanding of itself.

Call Committee members will also have the opportunity to participate in Call Committee training through the synod office.

The Council and Call Committee members will work together to complete the Congregational Mission Profile (this is a description of our congregation and the qualities we are looking for in a pastor) for First. Work on this Mission Profile will take several months. We need to take as much time as needed to assess what our congregation is about and what we want and need in a new Pastor.

LUTHERAN DISASTER RELIEF

You can be sure of this: when disaster strikes, Lutherans are there. The Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) has a division in it that keeps its eyes open for disasters, near and far, and organizes help for them. Once the Mission Profile is finished and Council and Call Committee are comfortable with it, the final product will be sent to Pastor Sarah Lee-Faulkner, Assistant to the Bishop and head of Congregational Calls, for review and then sent to Bishop Kusserow.

Once the Bishop receives the Mission Profile, he can then begin to send names of prospective candidates to the Call Committee. Receiving names can take quite a while and possibly several years.


When the Call Committee enters into the interview process, the specifics of the potential candidates are all confidential.

The congregation will be kept apprised of where we are in the Call process. There may be some gaps between updates – these things do take time. Once we enter into the interview process, a new “What’s next” will be published for you.
