Team members can march at the location of their choice. The March for Parks raises funds for the County Parks and Trails.

## 2018 LENTEN CONGREGATIONAL PROJECT

We've bought pigs, built "Lenten Loos" and supplied first aid kits to communities around the world.

This year let's help folks in different countries build community vegetable gardens! With a plot of land and good soil, adding drought-resistant seeds and topping it off with tools and training, plenty of tomatoes, potatoes, cabbage, beans and other vegetables can be grown to go around. Extra produce can be sold and the profit shared by the members of the cooperative to provide a great combination of food and income.



It takes about \$200.00 to start a community vegetable garden. Throughout the 40 days of Lent we will be gathering offerings in our homes and bringing those offerings to worship on Easter Sunday (Place your offering in an envelope with your name and "Community Vegetable Garden" on the outside of the envelope.). How many gardens can those in need grow through our gifts?

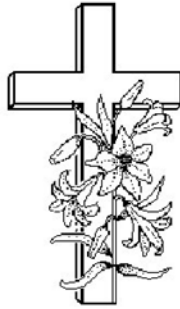

## **New in our library this month:**

***Declaration on the Way***, Church, Ministry and Eucharist – Declaration on the Way celebrates fifty years of international and regional Lutheran-Catholic dialogues and harvests the results of those efforts into Statements of Agreement on church, ministry, and Eucharist. It invites both communions to affirm the unity achieved through these agreements and establish church practices that reflect this growth. Read and discuss *Declaration on the Way* in adult study groups, affirm and celebrate these Lutheran-Catholic agreements, and take steps toward greater unity in your neighborhood or community.

## **New in library for young teens and children:**

***Looking for Home*** by Arleta Richardson – The first book in the “Beyond the Orphan Train Series” will take you back to 1907 Pennsylvania and into real-life adventures of four children in search of a true home. With both parents gone and his older brothers and sisters unable to help, eight-year-old Ethan Cooper knows it's his responsibility to keep his younger siblings together – even if that means going to an orphanage.

***Haunted Waters*** by Jerry B. Jenkins – This is the first book in the Red Rock Mysteries series for teens. Bryce and Ashley Timberline are normal 13-year old twins, except for one thing – they discover action-packed mystery wherever they go. Wanting to get to the bottom of any mystery, these twins find themselves on a nonstop search for truth.

***God Gave Us Family*** by Lisa Tawn Bergren – A heartwarming and colorful addition to the best-selling God Gave Us series, this tale will delight young hearts and help them understand how families of all types reflect God's unconditional love.

**10 Bible Stories for the Whole Family** (DVD) – Finding the meaning in many of the Bible's stories can be difficult for children, but this ten-film animated collection solves that problem with easy-to-understand tales of compassion, courage, faith and more. Kids will love these colorful classics and parents will appreciate the lessons they teach.
