The essays in *One Hope* are the product of an intense collaborative process by six gifted scholars and pastoral leaders, three Lutheran and three Catholic.

New in our Children's library:

The Green Tent Mystery by Paul Hutchens – Book 19 in the Sugar Creek Gang series for 8 – 10 year olds. On a dark summer night, the Sugar Creek Gang stumbles across a woman digging a hole in an abandoned cemetery. Discover the important role that Bill Collins' little sister Charlotte Ann plays in solving the mystery.
