

The people may greet one another with a sign of Christ's peace and may say Peace be with you or similar words. The assembly is seated.


THE MEAL

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.


It is right to give our thanks and praise.

- Cups can be placed in the trays near each side aisle as you return to your pew.
- For those who would like to receive communion, but are not comfortable coming to the rail, please let an Usher know so that the Pastor and Assisting Minister can bring communion to you.

and each person may respond Amen.

After all have received,

The body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ strengthen and keep you in his grace. **Amen**.
