

The people may greet one another with a sign of Christ's peace and may say Peace be with you or similar words.



who on this day overcame death and the grave,


and by his glorious resurrection opened to us the way of everlasting life.

- Cups can be placed in the trays near each side aisle as you return to your pew.
- For those who would like to receive communion, but are not comfortable coming to the rail, please let an Usher know so that the Pastor and Assisting Minister can bring communion to you.

and each person may respond Amen.

The body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ strengthen and keep you in his grace. **Amen**.
