Pastor's Note

Jesus said to her, "Do not hold on to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father. But go to my brothers and say to them, 'I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." John 20:17

Dear Friends in Christ,

I suspect that you will be receiving this newsletter just as Holy Week begins. We will have journeyed with Jesus as He triumphantly entered into Jerusalem and we anticipate what comes. Thursday when He will share a meal with the disciples; Friday when He will be crucified; Sunday when He leaves us an empty tomb. It is a journey through the lowest of lows, to get to the highest of highs.

I have recently been reading through Martin Luther's Easter Book. This book was given to me as a gift by a dear sister in Christ at my ordination and it is a gift in more ways than one. This little book contains selections from Luther's sermons and in the section related to the Resurrection, I found a gift that I want to share with all of you.

We often speak of each other as sisters and brothers in Christ. Referencing this verse from John, Luther lifts out this specific portion of Jesus' exchange with Mary. Luther says, "[One] who would be a Christian, let [them] learn these words, 'you are my [brothers and sisters]." This takes on great significance for Luther and I think is a profound word of grace for us today. He says, "One who is a [brother or sister] is neither a lord nor a servant. There is no greater word in all Scripture [than] this one, "Go say unto my [brothers and sisters]." He continues with discussion of what this would mean should the King of France or England say it to us.

Luther concludes with this, "if, then we are his [brothers and sisters], we are in the same inheritance and rights as he. We are not, indeed, Christ himself, but we enjoy the same privileges, and since he ascends to the Father, then, the Father and Christ and the [brothers and sisters] will be made as it were, into one loaf."

Sisters and brothers in Christ --- this is the good news of Easter. As we are claimed as brothers and sisters by Christ we are made "into one loaf," we are the family of God and because of Christ we, "are in the same inheritance and rights as he." Not because we deserve such, but because of the Grace of God.

First Lutheran offers Camperships. Register with Lutherlyn, then let the office know the title and dates of the camp and a Campership will be sent to Lutherlyn.



Excerpts from WHY AREN'T PEOPLE COMING BACK?

(Peter W. Marty, Editor/Publisher of THE Christian Century)
Dear friends.

I am going to assume you're a positive person who enjoys people, radiates goodness, and thrives on hope. I'm also



Well, keep the doors of your church and heart wide open. Don't write off anyone's place in your community unless they insist on it. Restarting a lapsed habit can be more difficult than creating a brand new one. Let's not forget the growing secularization of culture and rising religious indifference staring us all in the face. Much of the public perceives faith as having limited social value. "We now live in a time," says Andrew Root, "where the very idea that God is real and present in our lives is no longer accepted. Indeed, it's widely contested." Skepticism about the benefits of religious community has caused many people to quit looking to the church for personal meaning or identity.

First, remember that God has given the church a bigger and better hope than what the world lives by. How you communicate this beautiful idea that we follow a light brighter than the flicker of our own little bulb is up to you.

Second, don't forget to love your Christian community as you find it, not merely as you wish it were. Anybody can talk up their love for Jesus. But the church is the one place where we actually meet the living and present Christ.

Third, remind yourself that your church needs to welcome and accept people for who they are, and then love them into who they get to become in Christ.

Fourth, keep looking for ways to grow and share the energy that ought to be evident in your church when people come together around a shared purpose.

Finally, delight in every sign of your congregation's faithfulness. Fixating on who's not in the pew is a worthless and suffocating exercise. There is no convincing anybody of their need for Christian community. They have to want it. And their best chance for discovering that desire may come from observing the joy that's in you.
