Dear Friends in Christ.

What Child is This; this famous hymn (ELW #296) written by William Chatterton Dix is one of my favorite Christmas hymns. I am not exactly sure why this is the case. It might be because I listened to the tune (Greensleeves) over and over again in the lounge of the church that I grew up in. A Winter's Solstice remained on the record player for many years and at many times, when I was waiting for something I would turn this on. Even though it was instrumental, I always heard the words of What Child is This in my mind.

As we enter the month of December we have already begun the season of Advent. It is a season of expectant waiting. We expect that Christmas will come and of course it will, but we still have to wait. In this time of waiting, perhaps take some time to consider what, or rather who, it is that we wait on. It is a child, the only Son of God, "the babe, the son of Mary!"

While this entire hymn is worth contemplation, I think the second verse is particularly worthwhile. "Why lies he in such mean estate where ox and ass are feeding? Good Christian fear; for sinners here the silent Word is pleading. Nails, spear shall pierce him through, the cross be borne for me, for you; hail, hail the Word made flesh, the babe, the son of Mary!"

I wish you all a blessed Advent as you wait expectantly for Christmas and the birth of our Savior. May you and your families have a Blessed and Merry Christmas!
