


THE PARABLES OF JESUS



MAY NOISY OFFERING IS FOR SETON HILL COMMUNITY OUTREACH

For May and June's Noisy Offering, we will be collecting for Street Outreach organized by Seton Hill University's School of Physical Therapy. The group hopes to meet the needs of and provide medical care to individuals who are unhoused or experiencing rough sleeping. Currently they only consist of physical therapists and other non-clinicians, but as they assess the needs of the community, they plan to reach out to other medical providers to ask them to participate as well. They are modeling themselves after Street Medicine which was founded in Pittsburgh over 30 years ago. It is now an international community of providers but its roots started in Western PA and we would like to expand the outreach in our region beyond Pittsburgh.
