
CONGREGATIONAL MEETINGS, NOVEMBER 5 AND 19

Through your Bank:

To set up payments, go to your bank's website (Citizens Bank was used for this example) and look for the "Pay Bills" tab. Click on this tab and then "Add Company". Then click on Charities, then other and enter First Lutheran Church, address and phone number. If you need to enter an account number, use "offering" or "donation", or follow the instructions on your banks website.

Once this is set up, you can give any time, can set up automatic giving, and even put a note as to where you want the donation to go (i.e. flowers, memorials, etc). The bank then sends a check to the church from your account. So simple!
