Pastor's Note

Now thank we all our God with hearts and hands and voices, who wonderous things has done, in whom this world rejoices; who, from our mother's arms, has blest us on our way with countless gifts of love, and still is ours today. (ELW 840).

Dear Friends in Christ,

The air is getting increasingly brisk as we are reminded that autumn is here. As we enter the month of November it seems that anxiety levels are on the rise. Many are wondering how the elections will turn out and what that will mean in the months to come. At the same time, war continues in Ukraine and in the Middle East. Of course, we also have those challenges that we are facing on a more personal level.

While many things may weigh heavy on our minds, the month of November is also a month focused on thanks as we prepare to celebrate Thanksgiving at the end of the month. It may seem a challenge to be thankful given those situations we face that are challenging at best, but we have much to be thankful for and I was reminded of that great hymn of thanksgiving, *Now Thank We All Our God*.

This beloved hymn of thanksgiving was written by a little known German pastor named Martin Rinkart. This beautiful hymn becomes even more remarkable, I think, when we consider the life of Pastor Martin.

Most of his life was lived through the Thirty Years War. He ministered to the people of Eilenburg, a walled city which became a refuge for people from all around. In addition to the many lives lost during battle, famine and overcrowding led to the rapid spread of disease. As a result of these circumstances, Rinkart is said to have officiated more than 4,000 funerals in 1637 alone.

The Westmoreland County Children's Bureau makes arrangements for children from birth to 18 years of age in family emergencies. These children are often removed from their homes with only the clothes they are wearing and little if any personal belongings, such as a toy or a favorite stuffed animal. The Bureau maintains a "children's closet" for those under their supervision. The closet is currently low on supply items, namely children's socks, underwear and toys.

Thrivent Financial Action Team is collecting new toys, children's socks and underwear for the children under the care of the Westmoreland County Children's Bureau. One way you can help these children in need is to donate children's socks, underwear and toys. Collection boxes are located in the education building foyer, the narthex at the back of the church, and in the Fellowship Hall.
