Pastor's Note

"As Jesus went ashore, he saw a great crowd; and he had compassion for them, because they were like sheep without a shepherd; and he began to teach them many things.

(Mark 6:34, NRSV)

Dear Friends in Christ,

It's back-to-school time once again. This always seems to be on my mind at this time of year. Of course, learning is a life-long activity, but at back-toschool time it isn't lost in the back of our minds. We know students that are getting their pencils and backpacks together, so that they are ready for that first day of class. Most of us probably know a few teachers too. They have been busy getting rooms ready or putting syllabi together, making sure they are ready for that first day as well. Here in the church, we are also getting ready for another year of Sunday School and the teaching and learning that will take place here at First.

As I was thinking about all of the back-to-school things, I was reminded of something from our Gospel a few weeks ago. A great crowd had followed Jesus and the disciples and when Jesus saw the crowd, he had compassion for them.... and he began to teach them many things. This passage doesn't spell out the "many things" that Jesus taught, but it is clear that Jesus had compassion for the people and he taught them.

I think it is fair to guess that Jesus taught the crowd about God and about God's love for them. I suspect that he taught them something about himself, something they may not have understood at the time but were still leaning in to hear. That he came for their sake so that they might know God's love for them, something they might come to understand as grace.
